



# Summer Water Bills Sting City Users!



Summer heat and outdoor watering brought the city's new water rates to the attention of many customers-through their pocketbooks.

Increased rates are required by the Rural Development Agency for us to qualify for \$2 million in grants for the Medford intertie.

Rates are based on projected revenue needed to make loan payments for the remaining \$6.1 million and fund operation and maintenance.

Historically the city's water rates weren't high enough to repay outstanding loans for the system or fund basic operation and maintenance costs.

The city's water rates will increase semiannually until we reach the required rate.

After the project is completed (summer of 2000) rates will level out, or even decrease slightly if funds warrant.


