

Participate in the future of Talent's *transportation*system

Mark your calendars for Friday, December 11, 1998, and plan to attend the Transportation System Planning Meeting. The meeting starts at 10 a.m. at Talent City Hall in the council chambers. This will be a joint meeting of the Talent Traffic Committee, interested citizens, Rogue Valley Council of Governments (RVCOG), and Oregon Department of Transportation to discuss opportunities for citizen involvement in transportation planning for the City.

RVCOG is coordinating a grant-funded planning project that will result in a twenty-year plan for improvements to roads, sidewalks, bike facilities, and public transit. Citizen input is important for the development of a Transportation System Plan that will meet our needs for the future. There will also be a series of three evening meetings in the winter and spring to encourage citizen participation.



PRESENTATION:

Representatives from the Rural Utilities Services of the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Oregon Safe Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program will attend *this* City Council meeting to officially announce their participation in the Talent and Phoenix (TAP) Water Improvements Project. The City will receive a \$4,141,000 loan and \$2,000,000 grant from the Rural Utilities Service and a \$2,000,000 loan from the Oregon Safe Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program.

PUBLIC HEARING:

A public hearing will be held to receive comments about proposed adjustments to water rates. The water rate increases are required in order for the City to qualify for a \$2,000,000 grant and loans in the amount of \$6,141,000 for the TAP Water Improvement Project. The funding agencies require rate increases to insure the City's ability to repay the loans and properly maintain the water system. The proposed rate increases resulted from a Water Rate Study recently completed by Lee Engineering, Inc. Water rates are proposed to increase by 5% on March 1,1999, and by 10% on March 1, 2000.

ALSO ON THE AGENDA, THE COUNCIL WILL...

- Review and discuss a proposal from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) to amend Oregon Administrative Rule 845-005-0026. If approved, the amendment would allow OLCC to deny a license which allows the sale of alcohol by the drink to businesses such as laundromats, barber or beauty shops, shoe stores, etc.
- Consider a Resolution appropriating the Meyer Memorial Trust Grant funds of \$10,000 for completion of the skatepark portion of the Downtown Park.
- Consider a Resolution transferring funds within the General Fund to provide for Mayor and City Council compensation and unanticipated structural repairs to the Community Hall bell tower.
- Review the performance of the City Administrator/Recorder.

The Meyer Memorial Trust Foundation of Portland has awarded the City of Talent with a \$10,000 grant to be used exclusively for the skating area of the Downtown Park. Representatives from the foundation came to Talent in mid October to discuss plans for the park and community benefits. Shortly after, we

were granted the money to help finish the skate area. "It's exciting news," said Dave Bobb, Construction Coordinator for the project. "We're ready to get back to work as soon as we get a break in the weather. Hopefully we'll be able to get busy again this season, but if not, we'll be back at it in Spring."

The D.A.R.E. Program is Coming to Talent!

The City of Ashland has donated

D.A.R.E. Officer Bob Smith to talk to three 5th grade classes here in Talent. The program started December 4, 1998, and will continue for 17 weeks.



Officer Smith will be teaching his classes every Friday, for one hour per 5th grade class.

D.A.R.E. stands for Drug Awareness Resistance Education. Officer Smith says it's more than just drug education. "It's a life skills program," he says. "It's a program that teaches about consequences, self-esteem, peer pressure, and dealing with stress. It also addresses topics like violence in the media, gang and group violence, making good decisions, and it offers positive alternatives to bad situations. I teach skills that these kids can use in everyday life. We will also have drug-free mentors from the high school come talk to the students about the pressures of school and their peers."

Upon completion of the program, there will be an actual D.A.R.E. graduation ceremony. A few weeks prior to graduation, the students will be asked to write an essay and, at the ceremony, chosen students will share their essays with the audience. We would like to thank the City of Ashland and Officer Bob Smith for helping to educate the children in our community.

Leash Laws?!
