

The water committee reports that the intertie project is screaming along at a snail's pace. Federal requirements say a reservoir location has to be secured, followed by a 30-day public comment period, then we wait for fund approval, followed by a 15-day comment period, followed by a biological impact analysis... ...you get the picture. Meanwhile, engineering design proposal requests are going out. The engineer chosen will spend a year in design. Construction takes one year. That's about two more years.

Talent's Parks Commissioners are energized and making big changes in our city's parks.

Wednesday, April 8, the final plans for redesign of Chuck Roberts Park will be discussed at the 7 PM parks meeting at City Hall. Chair Gordon Mobley says there's still time to add ideas to what's planned.

Fundraising efforts for the new downtown park behind the post office is branching out to corporations who award grants for community enhancement.


At the individual level the \$25 engraved bricks are available.

A copper plate on the brick memorializes the donor.

The park will be much more than a skate facility. Phase II and III include rolling lawns around a two story gazebo for concerts. The gazebo will house a concession kitchen and rest rooms below. Rest rooms and all related plumbing costs have been donated by Bear Creek Valley Sanitary.

The Joseph Dr. house that lost its land to Wagner Creek in the 1997 flood is sitting safely on Talent Ave. Its old location and

the lot next door where the Speces house fell into the creek are now open space parks. The city is adding landscaping to keep the banks stable.
