

## When you set your clocks, change the batteries in your smoke detector!

#### City Council Agenda April 21, 1999

The City Council will consider the adoption of a Correction Plan for the Municipal Water Supply System which relates directly to the new Construction Moratorium. The Council will also consider the adoption of City Council Goals for fiscal year 1999-00 and consider a recommendation from the Community Center Restoration Commission relating to the installation of a new heating system in the Community Hall.

#### **Budget Committee Meeting**

April 21, 1999 (following City Council meeting)

A Budget Committee will directly follow the City Council Meeting. The Budget Committee will review the proposed Budget for 1999-00, and hold a public hearing to receive comments about the budget. The proposed 1999-00 will be available for public inspection beginning Friday, April 16, 1999 at 8:30 a.m. at the City Hall.

## An Update on Talent's Water Situation

The City is currently in the design engineering phase of the TAP Intertie and Water Improvements project. The cities of Talent, Ashland and Phoenix are participating in this joint venture to bring water from the Medford Water Commission to this end of the valley. The project includes the construction of a water transmission line approximately six miles in length, connecting Medford's system to Talent's system. The water transmission line will be constructed in the Highway 99 right-of-way.

Talent's portion of the project includes the construction of a new water reservoir. The new reservoir will provide us with additional water storage which will improve our ability to meet daily peak demands. Additional water storage is also important for fire suppression and other emergency situations.

The project will go to bid later this summer, and construction should begin in early fall. The project should be complete by the end of the year 2000. The project is completely funded by state and federal grants and loans.

The City is currently under a building moratorium. This building moratorium prevents new construction which would increase demands upon our current water system. This building moratorium is necessary because the City's existing water system currently operates at maximum capacity for long periods of time to meet the needs of our existing water users, and we use as much water as our existing water rights allow. The 1997 New Year's Flood destroyed our water intake system at our Bear Creek Water Plant. Since the flood, we have drawn water from the creek through a temporary intake system. Our system is vulnerable during heavy rains, and has difficulty keeping up with supply demands during hot weather. The building moratorium will be in place until the TAP Intertie project is complete. This project will resolve our water capacity problems and allow us to provide water service to new customers.

# What is the **Urban Renewal Agency** and what do they do?

The Urban Renewal Agency (URA) was formed in 1990 for the purpose of eliminating blight and deterioration within a defined area of Talent (see map below for Urban Renewal Agency boundaries). Its board members represent a cross-section of interests. Three members are from the City Council, three are Talent citizens, and three are members of the business community but not necessarily Talent residents. The Agency also retains an attorney, an engineering firm and an auditor, and City Administrator Leahnette York presently serves as the Executive Director. So, what do they do? At this time, the Urban Renewal Agency is involved in the Downtown Park Project, the future transportation depot, and they are working towards completion of Talent Avenue renovations from Wagner Creek Bridge to Rapp Road. The URA rebuilds streets, sidewalks, replaces old water and sewer lines, puts some utilities underground, plants trees, installs light posts, purchases property for economic development and builds parks. Future enhancement projects are planned for all the neighborhoods within the Urban Renewal Boundaries. The budget for these projects comes from loans, which are repaid with a portion of property tax funds. Currently there are three vacancies on the board. The agency meets once a month to discuss current and future projects. If serving on the Urban Renewal Agency Board sounds like an opportunity for you, then come on down to City Hall and fill out an application.
