

An update from the Talent Police Department



The Police Department and its officers are in need of helmets – new or used (in good condition). State law requires that all bicycle riders under the age of 16 wear a helmet at all times. To help kids comply with the rules, the department and its officers give helmets away to youths who need them. Unfortunately, their supply has been depleted. If you would like to make a helmet donation or a cash donation to purchase helmets, please contact the Talent Police Department at 535-1253.

Chief Smith would like to remind all children that the Police Department will be enforcing the helmet law. Any bicycle rider under the age of sixteen can be cited for not wearing a helmet. Chief Smith stands behind the helmet law and commented on the possibility of injury from not wearing one, "As a parent who has seen the suffering of person with a brain injury, the helmet issue will be of strong concern for me, and as it should be for any parent in this community. Having spent the last year and a half, in and out of brain injury rehabilitation centers, I have seen many young people suffer from brain injuries due to the lack of proper protective gear. Trust me, I know what I am talking about."

An Update from Jackson County Fire District No. 5

We'd like to remind everybody that we are now in **high fire danger**, which means that everything is drying out and the chances of starting a fire are much higher. There are some precautions that need to be taken when using lawnmowers or other power tools around dry grass. You can get specific information by calling Fire District No. 5 at 535-4222. As the days become hotter, we will be moving into **extreme fire danger**, so please be extra careful as things begin to dry out.



Also be aware of summertime thunderstorms which can cause downed power lines. If you encounter a downed power line, DO NOT touch it! Especially if the line comes in contact with any metal, such as a chain link fence. The whole area can become energized and become a shock hazard. Please call 911 immediately to prevent any accidents. Let's have a safe summer together.

City Council to Consider Utility Fees

Maintaining adequate public infrastructure systems is the supreme challenge for most cites, and Talent is no exception.

After adopting system development charges (SDC's) for streets, water, parks and storm drainage, the City Council now turns its attention to street and storm drainage utility fees.

Whereas SDC's are a one-time assessment on new development for adding capacity demand, utility fees are paid monthly for on-going use of the system. Together, SDC's and utility fees establish a sound basis for ensuring adequate systems while equitably spreading the cost of infrastructure across the community.

The City currently has a utility fee for water. In the coming months, the Council will be considering a similar user fee for streets and storm drainage. Stay tuned to the FLASH for announcements of upcoming public hearings on this important subject. The City wants to hear from you!
