Police Department in need of helmets

The Talent Police Department has once again depleted their supply of bicycle helmets and are seeking donations of new or used (in good condition) helmets. Helmets will not be issued if they fit improperly or are a replacement to a lost or stolen helmet previously obtained from the police department.

Recycling programs offered in Talent

Ashland Sanitary and Recycling Services has many recycling programs for residential and commercial uses. Below is a list of services (and a brief description) provided by Ashland Sanitary.

Curbside Recycling: The curbside recycling program is available to everyone within the Ashland and Talent city limits. Recycle bins are blue in color and signal drivers that you have recyclables to be taken away. Your bin must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on your regularly scheduled trash day.

Multi-family Recycling: Curbside collection is offered for residential units of two or more.

From March 6 to April 3, 2001, you can drop your used phone book in any one of the specially marked collection containers at the following locations:

Ashland Sanitary Services & Recycling Depot – Water Street and Van Ness Avenue

Rogue Valley Mall – 1600 N. Riverside

Commercial Cardboard: Ashland Sanitary supplies 1, 1 1/2 or 2 yard containers for your business to recycle corrugated cardboard. Pick-up days are Monday, Wednesday, and/or Friday.

Commercial Paper: Ashland Sanitary provides assistance in starting or expanding an office paper recycling program at your business or school. They will provide you with everything you need to recycle office paper. Pick-up days are Wednesdays.

Full Service Recycle Pick-up for Schools and Restaurants: Every Wednesday, they pick-up everything that is accepted at the recycling center. There <u>is</u> a cost for this service.

If you are a Talent resident and would like to participate in curbside recycling, you can obtain a blue recycle bin from City Hall, 204 East Main Street. If are interested in other recycle programs offered by Ashland Sanitary, give them a call. Their number is 482-1471.
