Working Around School Construction

Talent's Community Service Officers, Tony Marin, Vern Dean, and Frank Falsarella can be seen every morning at the crosswalks near Talent elementary and middle schools. These gentlemen voluntarily battle adverse weather conditions to ensure young children get to and from school safely. However, their efforts have not gone unnoticed. The kids at Talent Middle School outfitted each one of them with a hat to keep their heads warm and thermal gloves to keep their fingers from freezing. They even sent a card thanking our CSO's for their dedication to child safety. Tony, Vern, and Frank were all touched by their generosity and kind words.

With construction underway at the elementary school, our CSO's have the added responsibility of directing traffic. Talent Elementary School Principal Jeff Fagan commented on the closure of West Wagner to bus traffic only, "In order to ensure the safety of our children, we were granted permission from the City to close West Wagner, between the school and the Boys

and Girls Club, when busses are present. Once construction is finished, we will have an extended parking area, which will be safer for dropping kids off and picking them up. That portion should be complete by the end of April." He stated they are also building a new gymnasium and a large covered play area that can be used during inclement weather. He expects that part of the project to be complete in August of 2002.

New Design Standards for Old Town

The Old Town district encompasses Talent's traditional downtown core area, including Talent Avenue from Colver Road to Rapp Road, Main Street to the elementary school, and surrounding neighborhoods. It includes over 72 historically-significant homes, commercial buildings, and sites. Recently, new design standards for Old Town have been adopted as a way to guide remodeling and new construction in a direction that complements the town's historic buildings and small town atmosphere.

It is recommended that property owners within the Old Town district familiarize themselves with the new design standards, especially if they plan to remodel, rehabilitate, or upgrade the exterior of a building. There are some materials, such as vinyl siding, metal roofing, and certain fencing types, that are no longer permitted under most circumstances.

Recycle Your Phonebooks—*Curbside*!

Ashland Sanitary and Recycling will now be accepting all phonebooks as part of your regular curbside recycling. If you are not familiar with this service, the curbside recycling program is available to everyone within the Ashland and Talent city limits. Recycle bins

are blue in color and signal drivers that you have recyclables to be taken away. Your bin must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on your regularly scheduled trash day. If you are a Talent resident and would like to obtain a

blue bin, please stop by City Hall, 204 East Main Street, between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m.

I want to remind citizens of a few of the programs we offer at the Talent Police Department. First, we have our Car Seat program, designed to help low-income families comply with the new law requiring kids to be in car seats. Second, we have Business and Residential Security Checks of your home or office. This is a free service, but you must make an appointment before we'll come out. Our third program is new—the Explorer/Cadet program, which is already generating lots of interest. To apply for this program, you must be between the ages of 16 and 20, able to obtain an Oregon driver's license, submit to a background check, and have a minimum 2.5 G.P.A. in school.
