Talent Police Recruiting for Greenway Volunteers

Hi, this Chief Bob Rector of Talent PD and I'm writing to ask for your help. Talent PD is looking for a few good folks to lend a hand as volunteers. We're looking for people who would like to serve Talent in the role of Community Service Officer (CSO) to help patrol our park areas. We've seen an increasing need for an official presence in City parks and on the Bear Creek Greenway, and our CSOs are being tasked to provide much of that presence.

Patrol of the Bear Creek Greenway is designed to deter criminal conduct and offensive behavior, help educate Greenway users about greenway rules, and help enforce violations of the Greenway ordinance (dogs not on leashes, for example). This patrol can be done on foot, by bicycle, or by vehicle. CSO personnel would provide a uniformed presence, be given training, uniforms and some equipment, and supervision to carry out their duties. Volunteers are needed for various times throughout the daylight hours.

Applications Pending:

Suzy Stotler-deRuyter has applied for a Site Plan Review to establish an Accessory Dwelling Unit at 319 S. Front Street. The property is zoned R1-6. The Planning Commission will review the application at the public hearing on February 26th. Decisions are based on the approval criteria found in Article 23, "Site Plan Review" and Article 28, "Accessory Dwelling Units" in the Zoning Ordinance.

Lauren Bell has applied for a Conditional Use Permit to establish a daycare at 105 W. Main Street. list of addresses participating in the yard sale. The cost is \$3 to have your address included on the list and you can contact Allison at City Hall for more information.

On May 15th, the Talent Enhancement Committee will host a Green-Up and Clean-Up Day in which they encourage all Talent residents to get involved in the clean-up of trash in this community. Planning Commission Decisions:

At their meeting on January 22nd, the Commission approved a variance from the sign ordinance (Ord. No. 720) permitting a sign slightly larger than is typically allowed in a residential zone. The applicant was Phoenix-Talent School District. The Commission found that the elementary school is a unique, civic use that warrants a larger sign.

Improvements for Chuck Roberts Park

Recently a landscape plan has been developed for Chuck Roberts Park.
Construction of an irrigation system is underway and is expected to be completed by the end of March (weather permitting).
Also in March, the restroom facilities should be open and ready for use.

The City will be installing pathways to the facilities at the eastern end of the park to access the tennis courts, etc. The tennis courts and basketball courts will be developed in the next few months with money from a grant the City received from the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF). In addition, Dan Bish of Plant Oregon has donated some trees that will be planted in spring. Park users can look forward to improvements being done by September or October.
