Dangerous driving, speeding and other careless or reckless driving behaviors have no place in our neighborhoods. If you witness an incident please report that to us. Please DO NOT make contact with the person, but instead record their license plate, date, time, location and then call it in to us. Once an officer

has this information, we can use it to find the owner's of the vehicle as well as the registered address. We then can contact that person and proceed from there by speaking with the driver and addressing the issue. We've found in the past that this approach works well to adjust driving behaviors, and we can't do it without your help. You may contact us anytime at our dispatch center at 776-7206.

#### **Items of interest**

On July 14 the Planning Commission approved the *concept plan* for "Lithia View, Phase 2" in the 1600 Block of Lithia Way at the south end of town. The proposal is for 15 singlefamily lots adjacent to a wetland. The property is zoned R1-6 and comprises 3.33 acres.

Also that night the Commission approved the *detailed plan* for B&D Business Park on Highway 99 adjacent to Wagner Creek, a mixed-use development containing six apartments, retail/office space, and the new headquarters for SOS Plumbing. On August 11 the Commission will look at the *detailed plan* for Clearview, a mixed-use development on 10 acres next to Anjou Club containing 55 homes, live-work buildings, and six retail/office buildings comprising nearly 21,000 square feet. The meeting will begin at 6:30 PM in the Community Center at 206 East Main Street.

## WATER BILLS



You may notice a difference

in your water bill this month. The City has changed software and the appearance and color of the bill will be different. We would also like to remind customers that when a property is sold it is important that both the seller and buyer contact City Hall to make sure we have the latest billing information. Sellers should call to stop the water service in their name and the buyer needs to file an application to set up an account.

The water is shut off when the seller notifies the City of his/her departure date. The buyer will need to apply for service and pay a \$60 deposit before the water can be turned on. The City reads every meter each month and if usage is recorded a bill will be generated and depending on notification, either the seller or buyer will be responsible for the bill. Proper notification will avoid misunderstandings on the proper billing.

To manage Public Work's time we do require 1 business day notification to implement the changes. The City does not connect or disconnect water service on the weekend therefore it is important to plan ahead.

The \$60 deposit is refunded in 2 years of nondelinquent activity or when an account is closed, whichever is first. Outstanding water charges will be deducted from the deposit prior to a refund being issued.
