From the Mayor's Office

In 2011, shortly after I became Mayor, I wrote a Flash article beginning with a quote from President John Kennedy, "Ask not what your Country can do for you, ask what you can do for your Country".



This was President Kennedy's call for volunteers. At the time I wrote this article, the City of Talent was having a difficult time finding volunteers to keep our Committees and Commissions functioning at a basic level. Today, our Committees and Commissions are functioning with a cadre of highly motivated volunteers. You can see the fruits of their labor in our City Parks, or in a number of community enhancement projects such as trail building, tree planting and community beautification. In the near future you will see Talent's first *Parklet*, (or pocket park) across from the library. The City will do some of the heavy work for this *Parklet* but design and landscaping will be a volunteer effort. Hopefully this will be the first of many such projects in Talent. I have said it before and I will say it again, and again – What makes Talent such a great place to live is not City Government, but the willingness of our citizens to volunteer and work together to make Talent the best place in the Rogue Valley to live. City Government can build and maintain infrastructure, but it takes the citizens involvement to build a vibrant and livable community.

Chuck Roberts Park

Construction of a new parking lot will begin at Chuck Roberts Park starting the last week in February. This project is being funded through Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality funding administered through the Oregon Department of Transportation combined with limited City funding. The construction of the project is scheduled to be completed around the end April, weather permitting. During the project construction there will be a slight inconvenience accessing the park, but access will be permitted throughout the length of the project. The project is being completed in two halves allowing parking and access to one side or the other throughout the duration of the project. The only time that parking will not be allowed in the parking lot will be the day that paving operations are being completed and residents will be notified in future flash articles as the time nears. This project is an exciting addition to the City's largest park that will include improvements such as porous pavement and grass parking for the use of the citizens along with improved landscaping and curb appeal.

ing 365/24/7 police coverage. This is attained because our officers use very little sick time and they come to work even when not feeling 100%. When coverage is needed, the officers adjust and adapt their schedules to be sure we are covered.

In mid-February Officer Bill May was patrolling when he saw a car run a red light. He attempted to make a stop but the vehicle began driving recklessly and Officer May backed off after obtaining a good description. With help from Ashland PD, Phoenix PD and Jackson County Sheriff's, the car was later found at a motel outside of Ashland. A search warrant was served on the motel and three suspects were taken into custody for mail theft and identity theft related charges. The US Postal Inspectors are now assisting on the case along with Medford PD. It is believed there are over 500 victims of these suspects.

This brings up some tips I have mentioned before:

1. Do not leave mail in unsecure mailboxes.
2. Get a locking mailbox.
3. Check your credit rating to see if any credit cards have been opened up without your knowledge.

Another item of interest is traffic related. Our officers enforce traffic laws to make our streets safer. Recently we received word that our efforts are working.

Talent has the distinction of having the lowest 4-year vehicular injury rate of all jurisdictions in the Jackson County Metropolitan Planning Organization area at .003 injuries per capita. The next lowest is Eagle Point at .004. The highest is the rural area at .036. The MPO as a whole is at .020 injuries per capita. The statistics indicate that the streets in Talent are pretty safe, which could be a reflection of the Talent Traffic Safety & Transportation Committee involvement, the enforcement of traffic laws, the operation and maintenance of the street system, the relatively high pedestrian and bicycle use in Talent, and other factors.

As the above information indicates,

there are 3 main factors that make streets safe including enforcement, engineering and education.

The one that seems to have the least effect is education. Here is one glaring example. There has been voluminous information put out about the dangers and illegality of talking or texting on a cell phone while driving. Yet, a very high number of drivers continue to do so with impunity. They also become quite irate when cited. The danger is the distraction of the phone. It is not just young people. I recently observed a woman in her 80's drive for several miles talking on the cell phone and swerving all over her lane, the other lane and the bike path. Unfortunately, I was off duty.

In the next few weeks Talent PD will increase traffic patrol to target cell phone violations. They are a serious violation because the driver commits other violations while using the cell phone such as failure to maintain a lane, running stop lights, failing to yield to pedestrians and a myriad of other dangerous violations. Please, just hang up and drive.

The Talent Police Department has a portable radar reader board on a trailer that is placed on the streets of Talent three days a week. This is a large screen board that gives the speed of oncoming cars with a built in warning for cars that go over a set speed. If you are experiencing speeding cars on your street and would like the radar trailer set up in your neighborhood, call the Talent Police Dept at 541-535-1253 and contact Officer Schweizer at ext #1109.
