With winter upon us, now is the

Important Winter Weather Water Tips

time to prepare for the possibility of an extreme winter season. Here are some tips that may prevent costly emergency repairs:

Locate your water shut off valve (see below for help).

Insulate your plumbing (hot water pipes too) in areas that are not heated such as crawl spaces, garages and outside.

Temporarily seal off crawl space holes during winter with foam or cardboard pieces.

Disconnect garden hoses before freezing temperatures arrive. Place insulated caps on all of your hose bibs. Before leaving on trips, do not set

your thermostats lower than 55*.

Maintain heat in any room that has plumbing fixtures, especially ones with plumbing located on outside walls. Open up cabinet doors under sinks to let the heat in.

Keep a VERY Small trickle of water (during EXTREME cold times only). It is harder for flowing water to freeze. This is most helpful for faucets that are father away from where your water enters the house.

If your pipes freeze, NEVER try to thaw with an open flame. Use a hair dryer or space heater to do the job.

If you are going to be away, ask a friend or neighbor to check your house during cold spells. If something breaks, they can act before it causes too much damage.

WINTERIZE YOUR SPRINKLER **SYSTEM**

This may be one of the most preparations. important winter Sprinkler systems are one of the most common reasons for water leaks. They are also one of the hardest leaks to detect because often a leak will NOT cause water to rise to the surface.

Turn off all of your sprinkler system controllers. If you disconnect the common wire during the winter it will ensure that your system can't accidentally be turned on.

Shut off the water to your sprinklers. Sometimes there is a valve that isolates the irrigation from the main house water supply. If you do not have one of these valves you may want to consider adding one to your System. Your Backflow Valve System should NOT be used for this purpose. That should be left open to allow for

Dain your individual sprinkler components as much as possible. Most new sprinkler systems are properly equipped to be professionally blown out with air. This is generally at a minimal cost. If yours is not equipped for this, you can briefly remove sprinkler risers or prop them open to help them drain. This is particularly important for systems that are equipped with check valves.

Installing drains at low points can be very helpful. If you do this, you may want to consider selecting a manual drain instead of an automatic drain. This allows you to control when it occurring after every irrigation cycle.

If a Water Pipe does Break: Shut off the Water

Look for your shut-off valve in the following places:

In the garage, near the water heater or laundry hookup.

In crawl space or basement, where the waterline enters the home.

Outside near the foundation, often protected by a concrete ring or clay

Can't find your Shut-off Valve?

If you can't find your waterline shutoff valve call a plumber to help you locate it. If you don't have one, you should have one installed. If you need to shut your water off at the meter, please call:

Please do not tamper with the water meter yourself as you are liable for damages.

Building Permit Applications: What is the procedure for getting building permits?

It sounds a little complicated, but it's not. First, contact the Community

Development Department staff to make sure you're starting off in the right direction. Typically for a structural permit, Planning issues a "Zoning Permit" to verify all land use code regulations are being met. Second, submit the necessary plans (varies depending on type and size of application, but most permits include a site plan, floor plan, structural plans, etc.) which then are reviewed by the Building Department staff. Finally, after the plans are reviewed and approved, the plans are ready to be issued and construction can begin. At various phases of the construction, inspections are necessary. The last inspection for a new structure will include a "Certificate of Occupancy" inspection in order to finalize the permit.

Building permits require various fees, regulated by the State of Oregon Building Codes Division. Further, other fees, such as System Development Charges or fees from Rogue Valley Sewer. For questions or more information, please call 541-535-7401. Building plans are accepted and issued Monday through Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

News from Talent Police Department By Chief Mike Moran

This past month Oregon City Police Reserve Officer Robert Libke was killed in the line of duty. His death has brought forth some thoughts I think it is important to share with you. Being a reserve , Officer Libke was not paid to put his life on the line in protecting citizens from the armed and violent 88 year old suspect. He paid his expenses for equipment, he donated weeks of his time to be trained and many more months of service were donated to the people of Oregon City. He highly deserves the many accolades he has received for sacrificing himself to protect others.

As part of the tribute paid to him, officers from around the country sent representatives to Portland to be part of his memorial service. Talent PD Officer Dan Moulin represented the citizens of this community and was part of the procession of police vehicles that stretched for nearly an hour.

Our department utilizes a small number of reserve officers. Currently we have one potential reserve candidate in training in the Reserve Officer Law Enforcement Academy. Our most recent two reserves moved from our program to take opportunities with other agencies. Stephen Barrett is an officer with the University of Oregon Public Safety Department. Derek Evans is now with the Central Point PD. We are very proud of them and wish them well in advancing their careers.

In my effort to congratulate and promote the good things my fellow PD employees do, I like to highlight accomplishments. Officer Gail Schweizer recently was recognized by Team Oregon, a group that teaches motorcycle riding and safety to Oregonians. Gail has served for twenty years as an instructor for Team Oregon. Gail is contributing to safer streets through this as well as his work in Talent making our streets safer through traffic enforcement and education.

Here is a tip on a fairly new scam you may not have heard about; rental property scams. This actually occurred in Talent. However, no money was lost.

Criminals post Craigslist ads that mimic actual property listings. They then alter the rental costs and contact information and persuade would-be renters to wire them a deposit or first month's rent. A clue is when there are two different ads on Craigslist with two different prices and two different people to make contact with. But there may just be one phony ad.

In a case in Central Oregon a wouldbe renter arrived at his new place with a U-Haul, and only then found that he had been scammed.

If you are planning to rent always meet in person to see the home and never send money without meeting the property owner or manager. Even then you may want to ask for identification to know who you are dealing with. Don't wire money!

This Holiday Season, please lock your homes and vehicles to protect yourself from criminals who constantly look for easy targets to steal from. Last month I mentioned extended hours of darkness leads to more crime. I just read a recent study that verifies my observations. This study said that crime goes up when Daylight Savings Time ends. This doesn't apply just to DST versus Standard Time. If vou have well-lit driveways and front porches around your house criminals are more likely to scurry away from your home. When you take some time and energy to protect yourself from crime, it pays off.

This has been a big year for the City's Utility Billing Department. We have added new utility billing and payment options for our citizens' convenience. Utility customers now have the following service options available for receiving and paying their monthly utility bill:

- · Email Utility Bill option
- · Monthly AutoPay option
- · Online Payment option
- · Phone Payment option

To sign up for the email utility bill and monthly autopay options, complete and return the authorization forms available at City Hall or by visiting the Utility Billing page on our website. Email utility bills are sent directly to your email account the first of each month. With AutoPay, we will debit your checking or saving account automatically on the 15th of every month. Utility bills can be paid online by visiting our website, www. cityoftalent.org and clicking on the 'Pay with GovTeller' button. Payments can also be made over the phone at 541-535-1566. And as always, payments can be made at City Hall, our drop box locations or mailed to P.O. Box 445 Talent Oregon. We hope these new options make it easier for you to receive and pay your utility bill each month. Watch for additional changes to come as we continue to improve our utility billing process.
