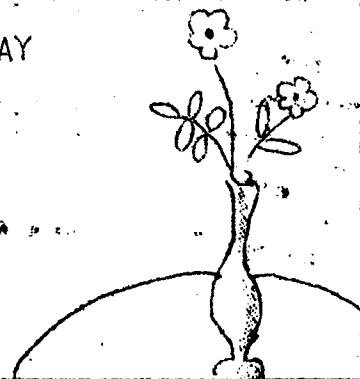

ELECTED COMMITTEE HEAD

Frank Christian was elected chairman of the county's new stray animal committee Wednesday night, although he is not yet a member of the committee.

Christian was elected to the position by nine members of the committee after the 10th member Eugene V. Hunt, Medford had submitted a letter of resignation.

County commissioner Edwin Taylor an ex-officio member, said Thursday that he had advised the advisory committee that Christian could not serve as chairman unless he is appointed to the committee by the county judge. The ten members were appointed by County Judge Earl Miller last Friday to consider the county's stray small animal problem, especially involving cats.

Dr. W.W. Weller, Ashland veterinarian, was selected vice chairman, and Mrs. R.G. Tabor, 10 Knoll Crest dr. was named secretary. Dr. Weller was asked to tabulate figures concerning cat disease in this area and present facts to the county court.

The committee had been asked by the court to make a study of the problem and report findings so the court could decide future action.
