Talent City Council

The Talent City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, March 9, 1971. Mayor Brittsan called the meeting to order at 8:03 P.M., with the following present: Lois Yockel; John Dickinson, Don Borns, Phil Carter, Bill Jamieson & Ed Owen. Also present were: Attorney Dames, Police Chief Roberts, Fire Chief Jim Cook, Recorder Vivian Gordon, Planning Commission Chairman Jim Ingersoll, and Utility Board Chairman Charles Thomas.

Talent Boy Scout Troop #110 presented the Colors, and the audience joined in the Pledge of Allegiance.

It was moved by Mr. Dickinson and seconded by Mr. Carter to pay the bills as presented. Motion carried with 7 yes votes, 0 nay.

It was moved by Mr. Carter and seconded by Mr. Dickinson to approve the minutes of the February meeting as presented. Motion carried with 7 yes votes, 0 nay.

Mrs. Gordon read an invitation to the Council to attend a reception to be held on Sunday, March 14, 1971, in honor of Police Chief and Mrs. Roberts' Silver Wedding Anniversary. The reception will be held in the old City Hall from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM.

Mrs. Gordon read a letter, received from BOVSA on March 9, 1971 at 2:50 P.M. The Authority invited a representative of the Talent City Council to meet with their Board of Directors on Wednesday, March 17, 1971, at 2:30 P.M., to discuss the proposed agreement.

Mrs. Gordon read the letter received from the Oregon State Highway Engineer, which included a resolution to apply for funds for paving for 1971-1972 allocation. The resolution was tabled until next meeting for further study.

Mr. Ingersoll of the Planning Commission gave their report. The Planning Commission recommends the zone change for an area in South Talent, as represented by the petition presented in January, since there were no objections at the Public Hearing. Motion carried with 6 yes votes, 1 abstained.

Mr. Ingersoll then reported that the next meeting of the Planning Commission will be a public meeting for the residents of South Talent to give their ideas of what they do and do not want for their area. Every one is invited to come and express their views. Mr. Ingersoll then reported that a new plat of the Mountain Vista Subdivision had been submitted with 7 lots, instead of the 17 on the original plat. The Commission approved the revised plat, and will now await the final plat to be presented by the engineer.

Mr. Thomas of the Utility Board gave their report. The Utility Board recommends approval for water to the Bowlin, Beeson and Duggan properties. Mrs. Gordon has their consent to annex on file. Mr. Thomas then reported on the beginning study for location of a new reservoir. They recommended an active study for location and perhaps an engineering study for future needs. Mrs. Yockel stated that perhaps a grant could be applied for to pay for the study.

Mr. Ingersoll reported for the Park Commission, due to the absence of George Zickfoose, Chairman. The Park Commission requested that the Council designate the areas around the City Hall grounds as part of the City Park Chain. It was moved by Mr. Borns and seconded by Mrs. Yockel to grant the request. Motion carried with 7 yes votes, 0 nay. Mr. Ingersoll presented the Park Commission Budget request to the Council.

Mr. Dames reported that the Talent Irrigation District Agreement has been signed by the T.I.D. Board, as well as the City of Talent.

Boy Scout Troop #110 read a pledge, as a service project, to pick up all the litter from the street and waysides within the City of Talent on March 13, 1971. They then requested the Council declare March 13 to 20 as Spring Clean Up Week. It was moved by Mr. Jamieson and seconded by Mr. Carter to grant the request. Motion carried with 7 yes votes, 0 nay.

After discussion, it was decided to table the bids for the side-walk on the north side of Main Street, from Front Street to 'I' Street, until next meeting.

Mr. Chris Hagler spoke about the Babe Ruth League Baseball Team for Talent and Phoenix. He made a request for a donation of \$50.00. It was moved by Mr. Owen and seconded by Mr. Carter to grant the request. Motion carried with 7 yes votes, 0 nay.

Police Chief Roberts report was: collected \$245.00 in fines; 14 traffic and 17 other arrests; 2 burglaries cleared; apprehended 7 juveniles for burglary; picked up 4 runaway juveniles; investigated 5 check cases; (cleared 4); cleared 2 petty larcenies; investigated 2 accidents; attended 2 Police Schools; conducted 2 Hunter Safety Courses -- 8 at the Junior High School and 8 at the City Hall. He worked a total of 285 hours; Patrolman Lynch worked 184 hours, and the Reserves worked a total of 20 hours.

Fire Chief Cook reported there were no fires or emergencies during the month of February. He attended 1 Fire Chief School. The firemen have been working on the Fire Hall, mostly painting.

The meeting adjourned at 9:06 P.M.
