Talent City Council

July 13, 1971

The Talent City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, July 13, 1971. Mayor Brittsan called the meeting to order at 8:00 P.M, with the following present: Lois Yockel, Don Borns, Phil Carter, John Dickinson, Bill Jamieson and Ed Owen. Also present were; Al Grabher, City Superintendent, Vivian Gordon, City Recorder; Police Chief Roberts; Ass't Fire Chief, Owen Kruger; and Robert Dames, City Attorney.

It was moved by Mr. Jamieson and seconded by Mr. Borns to pay the bills. Motion carried with 7 yes votes, 0 nay.

It was moved by Mr. Borns and seconded by Mr. Jamieson to accept the minutes of the last meeting as presented, Motion carried with 7 yes votes.

Mrs. Gordon presented 6 copies of the final papers of the B.O. R. (Bureau of Outdoor Recreation) for the application for a grant for drinking water at the Park. All six copies are to be signed by the City Council, then forwarded to B.O.R. for approval and funding.

Mrs. Gordon read a letter from Herman D. Cannon, protesting a bill for \$67.50 for water, adn surcharge, and \$40.00 for the coat of a water meter. It was moved by Mr. Carter and seconded by Mr. Jamieson to instruct Mrs. Gordon to write a letter of explanation, and set a date to turn off the water if the bill wa sn't paid. Motion carried with 7 votes.

Mr. Dames gave the second reading of Ordinance #271, titled "AN ORDINANCE CREATING A BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS FOR THE CITY OF TALENT, PRESCRIBING ITS POWERS AND DUTIES, AND ESTABLISHING THE TERMS OF OFFICE OF ITS MEMBERS. REPEAL OF ORD.#253 It was moved by Mr. Borns and seconded by Mr. Carter to adopt the ordinance. Motion carried with 7 votes,

It was moved by Mrs. Yockel and seconded by Mr. Carter to appoint Mr. Charles Inman and Mr. Richard Kirkham to the Park Commission. Motion carried with 7 vobes.

It was moved by Mr. Carter and seconded by Mr. Jamieson to appoint Mr. Robert Miller to the Planning Commission. Motion carried with 7 yes votes.

It was moved by Mr. Owen and seconded by Mr. Dickinson to appoint Mr. Stephen Grosscup to the Utility Board. Motion carried with 7 yes votes.

Six bids were received for a new backhoe. After discussion and questions to Mr. Grabher, it was moved by Mr. Dickinson and seconded by Mr. Carter to accept the lowest bid from Central Equipment, Central Point. The price is \$5,570.00, plus trade in. Added to the motion was the stipulation that the funds come half from the Street Department and half from the Water Department. Motion carried with 6 yes votes, 1 abstention.

Mr. Dames read Ordinance #273, titled "AN ORDINANCE IMPLEMENTING LOCAL VEHICLE LICENSE FEEW AS AUTHORIZED BY HB 1979 AS ADOPTED BY THE OREGON LEGISLATURE IN THEIR 1971 SESSION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY". After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Dickinson and seconded by Mr. Carter to delete the EMERGENCY CLAUSE and accept this as the first reading. Motion carried with 6 yes votes, 1 abstention.

Mr. & Mrs. Ward presented a request for re-zoning of 236 Gibson Street, to per0 mit installation of a mobile home. It was the decision of the Council that the request must be referred to the Planning Commission, and follow the regular channels for re-zoning.

It was moved by Mr. Carter and seconded by Mr. Borns to approve the Planning Commission's recommendation to permit the South rn Pacific Railroad to prepare a private trailer court of their property north of Main Street, beside the tracks. Motion carried with 7 yes votes.

Mt. Tate, Totem Pole Park, requested a correction of zoning on his property on South Pacific Highway. He is planning to expand the Park, and the area involved was excluded by error when the zoning map was drawn. The Council decided this too must go through the Planning Commission. A special meeting will be called for tomorrow night to begin proceedings.

Police Chief Roberts reported the following: \$284.06 collected in fines; 18 citations, and 6 other making a total of 24; 1 burglary cleared; 3 Juveniles arrested; investigated 2 auto accidents; worked 290 hours; patrolman worked 282 hours; handled 1 cases, and attended 1 Police School in Medford. He also reported that \$2,264.00 collected and \$700.00 worked out in fiscal 1970-71.

Assistant Fire Chief Owen Kruger reported 1 fire, 2 false alarms, 1 meeting and 3 training sessions in June. He requested help from the Council to insist that the old White Fire Truck be picked up by the owners, as it is in the way. It was traded in on the new pumper, received in February. Mayor Brittsan said he would write the necessary letter.

The meeting adjourned at 9:35 P.M,
