TALENT CITY COUNCIL

The Talent City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, Nov. 9, 1971, at 8:00 PM; meeting called to order by Mayor Brittsan with the following present: Lois Yockel, Don Borns, Phil Carter, Bill Jamieson and Cliff Metz. John Dickinson was absent. Also present were: Al Grabner, Charles Roberts, Robert Dames and Vivian V. Gordon.

Moved by Mr. Borns and seconded by Mr. Metz to pay the bills. Motion carried; 6 yes.

Moved by Mr. Borns and seconded by Mr. Jamieson to accept minutes of last meeting on Oct. 12, 1971, as presented. Motion carried with 6 yes votes.

Fire Insurance bids were received from Associated Insurance, Ashland; Singmaster Insurance, Ashland; Gatter Insurance, Medford. Discussion held after bid opening, with Mr. Singmaster, Mr. Kennedy and Mr. Eschoo being present to explain questions on the bids. It was decided to have Mrs. Gordon make copies of each bid for each of the Councilmen to study, and postpone any decision until a special meeting on Wed., Nov. 10, 1971, at 7:00 PM.

Mr. Dames gave the second reading of Ord. #276, titled, "AN ORDINANCE ORDERING THE CHANGE OF ZONE OF CERTAIN TERRITORY WITHIN THE CITY." This refers to a parcel of land, approximately 6 acres, at the end of 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Streets. The change of zone: from Class I, Single Family to Class II, Multiple Family. After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Carter and seconded by Mrs. Yockel to adopt the ordinance, thereby changing the zone. Motion carried with 5 yes votes, 1 nay.

Mayor Brittsan brought to the attention of the Council that now Old Pacific Hwy. is complete in resurfacing, and the walkway on the bridge across Wagner Creek is also finished. He requested permission of the Council to contact the County Court to take jurisdiction of the road, and take it into the city system of roads. The Council agreed unanimously.

Mrs. Gordon read a recommendation of the Planning Commission: "The Annexation of the properties owned by: Mr. Larry McBee, Mrs. Lois Yockel, Mrs. Hazel Pickering, Pacific Northwest Bell Telephone Company, Oregon State Highway fronting on U.S. 99, and part of Talent Bear Creek Park."

The Utility Board had no quorum at the last meeting, so no recommendations.

Mrs. Robby Miller, Chairwoman of the Park Commission, gave a report on the work being done and being planned at the Park. Cooperation by the State Highway has been offered in the form of materials and/or work.

Mr. Dames read Ordinance #277, titled, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN TERRITORY, AND ON THE FURTHER QUESTION OF WITHDRAWING THE SAID AREA FROM THE TALENT RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT AND DISPENSING WITH A CITY ELECTION ON THE QUESTION: FIXING A DAY FOR PUBLIC HEARING; AND DIRECTING THAT NOTICE BE PUBLISHED AND POSTED." This refers to the above Planning Commission recommendation. The Public Hearing will be held on Dec. 14, 1971. It was moved by Mr. Borns and seconded by Mr. Carter to accept the first reading, and to have a second reading tonight. Motion carried with 6 yes votes. Mr. Dames gave the second reading by title only. It was then moved by Mr. Carter and seconded by Mr. Metz that the ordinance be adopted. Motion carried with 6 yes votes.

Mr. Dames gave the first reading of Ord. #278, titled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING A PORTION OF ORDINANCE #263 BY INCREASING THE MINIMUM NUMBER OF SQUARE FEET IN A MOBILE HOME FROM 500 SQUARE FEET TO 600 SQUARE FEET." Second reading will be on December 14, 1971.

Mr. Dames gave the first reading of Ord. #279 titled, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A MINIMUM NUMBER OF SQUARE FEET IN IN A NEWLY CONSTRUCTED DWELLING HOUSE AND AMENDING ORD. # 168." Second reading to be Dec. 14, 1971.

It was moved by Mr. Borns and seconded by Mr. Carter to grant approval of the liquor license renewals received from Brittsan's Market, Talent Club and Tally Ho. Motion carried with 6 yes votes.

Mr. Jamieson reported complaints received about empty cartons left outside behind the Tally Ho. Mr. Grabner to investigate and see that practise is stopped at Mayor Brittsan's request.


The Utility Board also recommended adding \$35.00 to the cost of a water connection if necessary to cross a street and cut the pavement, Mr. Metz moved to change the fee to \$20.00 for every one, not just to the ones "across the street." The motion died for lack of a second.

Police Chief Roberts reported: \$225.50 collected in fines; 18 traffic arrests; 9 others; investigated 3 car accidents and 1 burglary; worked 300 hours; Patrolmen worked 200 hours; Reserves worked 26 hours; and he attended 1 Police School.

Ass't. Fire Chief Owen Kruger reported 3 fires in October; 1 tie fire on the RR Tracks; 1 car fire; 1 oil furnace smoking in a Service Station. The Fire Dept. had 1 meeting and 3 drills in October. Meeting adjourned at 9:04 PM.
