RECORDER RESIGNS

City Recorder Shirley Brown has submitted her formal letter of resignation to the Talent city council. November 15 was her last day on the job.

She was hired in January to replace Alice Theis.

PART-TIME PLANNER HIRED

Pamela Ray Zsoka, 30, a senior geography student at SOSC, has been hired by a unanimous vote of the City Council to become the city's consultant on current planning matters.

Zsoka is at the planning office from 1pm to 5 pm on Wednesdays. She will be paid on a contract basis only for actual time doing planning work for the city. Her salary will be paid by increased fees to builders and developers.

New planning fees will be set at a meeting on Nov. 20. City Attorney Roy Bashaw and comprehensive planner Dave Doerter will present the council with a new fee schedule.

The contract planner will do Talent's current planning as jobs come up--at no cost to the city.

Zsoka's contract with the city sets her salary at \$5 per hour for the time she spends preparing applications and answering planning questions. Maximum fees will be set for each normal planning function--from land annexations to conditional use permits.

The council added stipulations which forbid Zsoka to represent persons doing business with the city and which clarify her status as an independent contractor.

BANK MAY PLACE TEMPORARY BUILDING

The City Council has cleared the way for Valley of the Rogue State Bank to locate in the town.

The council adopted an ordinance that will apply to temporary structures. Basic requirements are a 120-day limit for the structures, a temporary building permit, compliance with building codes, and spacing at least 10ft. from adjoining structures.

Mayor Underhill had told the branch bank manager, Bob Murphy, that he saw no regulations to keep the temporary bank structure from locating between the post office and the Talent Club, & wanted to know if the council members felt the same way.

APARTMENTS OK'd IF NOT IN FLOODPLAIN

Plans for 8 apt. units between Talent Ave. and Wagner Creek were reviewed and approved by the Planning Commission at a meeting Nov. 7, with the understanding developer William Welch must have an engineer certify that none of the units would be built in the creek's floodplain.

The apt. project will be built at 237 Talent Ave.... Dave Doerter told commissioners that Wagner Creek's "100-year floodplain" has been plotted but the creek's floodway and flood fringe have not been defined.

Building is allowed on the flood fringe; provided it is shown that buildings are raised on their foundations so the floor level is higher than the 100-year flood level.

The land is zoned for apts., and only general floor plans are subject to Planning commission approval.

Welch told the commissioners each of the apts. in his proposed project will be 2-bedroom units. Total floor space will be 4,030 feet.

The developer agreed to dedicate 9,200 sq. ft. of land near the creek to the city for future development as part of a greenway system.

-----At this meeting-----
-----The commission accepted landscaping plans for a mini-warehouse storage building being built by Doug and Carolee Pautsch of Chico, Cal. The annexation of the land had been contingent on the commission's approval of the landscape plan.

-----Plans for a 21 lot subdivision in the 1200 block of Talent Ave. were put off because of lack of material to study the project.

John Tixier, director of the state Schoolboy Safety Patrol, Oregon Dept. of Education, was called in by Police Chief Charles Roberts and Principal George Johns. Tixier talked to police and school officials then the school held an assembly and had classroom instruction for 6th graders. Tixier gave the school the yellow flags and bright yellow helmets for the crossing patrol to wear.

The 60-person crossing patrol went to work late in October.

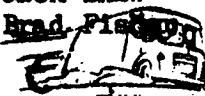
